Bread-Breakers; a New Vehicle for Christian Fellowship at Trinity?

While I was pastoring at Emmanuel in Longview, Washington, a young couple came in to talk to me to see if they could introduce a fellowship ministry for the summer called "Bread-Breakers." The church from which this couple had come had made it a summer ministry for several years to bring members of the congregation closer together. I gave them permission to see if they could find people willing to participate. We ended up with 8 groups of 8 people, which would meet once a month to enjoy a meal together at someone's home. The group decided the dates they would meet and the times.

Peggy and I belonged to a group and thoroughly enjoyed our involvement. We got to know people on a whole new level and had fun in the process. We also hosted one of the meals at our home, so people got to see a personal glimpse of their pastor.

I want to start a Bread-Breakers at Trinity this summer. There is a question mark behind the title because it all hinges on the congregation's willingness to get involved as to whether this happens or not.

Here's how we will decide if this will happen or not. I will have Wendy put sign-up sheets for 8 groups of 8 on the Fellowship Hall bulletin board. Participation is open to couples or singles, but we will limit this to adults only at this time. Signing up indicates you are willing to host one meal at your home. The host family provides the main course for the meal, while other participants of the group agree to bring a salad, a dessert, or a side dish. The hosts provide ice water and

coffee. If guests want to drink something else, they would bring it with them.

We will start in June and end in August. Each group of 8 will stay together for the entire summer. Hopefully, each month will feature a new host with non-hosts taking on a different course each month.

I hope we can fill up several groups of 8, but if we can only fill one, that group can meet for the summer. This is a very low-key ministry. It is focused on fellowship and having fun together. While I hope each meal would start with a prayer, and faith matters would be discussed from time to time, there is no Bible study accompanying the meal.

Each group has complete authority to choose when and where they'll eat their meal. They can meet for breakfast, brunch, lunch, or supper. Normally, I would see most meals being held at someone's house, but groups could also have a picnic at a nice shelter, meet on a boat, etc.

The question is, "Are you willing to invest some time and energy to get to know your church family better?" I pray you would be excited to sign up and would invite your friends to do so as well.

Secretary's Report:

The secretary's report was reviewed, Jim made a motion to approve, Tom seconded it, the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

Trustee's Report:

Discussion was had on some metal flashing on some of the shingles. The Trustees will have someone look at it.

Old Business:

New Business

Livestream-Scott VandenBerge reported that we have been having problems with the livestream. He met with Cole and Wendy to look at different options. We currently are using Sling which seems to be the problem. Castr is a different option and it seemed to work this past Sunday. This costs \$19.99 per month or \$149.99 if you pay for the full year. Jim made a motion to try Castr for one month and if it works ok to pay for a yearly subscription, Tom seconded the motion, the motion carried.

Pastor Dave asked the council to consider purchasing 12 flags to put outside of the church for Pentecost Sunday. This also falls on the Sunday that 10 kids will get confirmed. These flags have a base that would go into the ground with the flag sliding in on a pole. This is something you could use every year during Pentecost. The flag and pole system are \$103.75 each. Pastor Dave was wondering if this is something that the memorial committee would be willing to purchase. After discussion, Jim made a motion to ask the memorial committee to purchase the flags, if they decline, the flags would be taken out of the general fund, Carey seconded the motion, the motion carried.

Tony made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Scott V seconded it, motion carried.

We closed with the Lord's prayer.

1 Samuel 17:20-40

David found King Saul's reward for Goliath's defeat interesting—in fact, he asked to have it repeated twice (1 Sam. 17:26, 30). However, David may have been young, but he wasn't foolish. The reward was a nice perk, but it wasn't the young shepherd's motivation.

David's reason for standing against Goliath was to serve the Lord. He openly criticized the giant: "For who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he has dared to defy the armies of the living God?" (v. 26). Challenging the chosen nation of Israel was the same as defying the Lord Himself. David was prepared to defend Yahweh's holy name and His people, even against this fearsome warrior. A right and holy motive gives a person confidence to obey God, even if doing so defies human wisdom.

When facing life's Goliaths, we might be tempted to approach God with a plea like, I'm tired of being in this mess, or I want to run away but can't, so You'll have to remove this problem.

However, the right motive for facing a problem is the desire to follow, serve, and honor God—no matter what. Giant challenges may tax our comfort or wellbeing, but wanting a quick way out can impede our obedient walk with God. So pray, "Lord, help me to stand strong in Your name. And grant me victory over the Goliaths in my life, bringing you honor and glory each step of the way."


SUNDAY, MAY 5 Last Day of Sunday School Celebration
